ABRF Career Development Resources for Core Facilities Professionals

The role of core facilities personnel is often unique within an academic institution. Existing methods of professional recognition and advancement may not apply to the career paths for Core personnel or require modification to provide ways for ABRF members to grow.

ABRF offers a number of specialized Career Development resources to support your professional development. The opportunity to **present** at ABRF meetings, either virtually or in person, along with **publishing** options in ABRF's <u>Journal of Biomolecular</u> <u>Techniques (JBT)</u>, are open to all ABRF members.

The Career Development Committee has compiled a set of "job families" contributed by ABRF members, to provide sample role descriptions for the distinct roles in core facilities. Review these to see how they may apply to your role and the structure of your core.
