ABRF 2020 Annual Meeting: Empowering Team Science

The <u>2020 ABRF Annual Meeting</u>, February 29 to March 2, 2020 in Palm Springs, offered valuable education and networking opportunities for all participants. ABRF2020 attracted a record number of session and poster submissions and participants, who attend the meeting for the latest in technology, shared resource management best practices, and networking. The keynote and sessions reflect these trends, ranging from updates on ABRF Research Groups to the ABRF Award Recipient, Dr. George Church, presenting on steps needed to the enable the next revolution beyond his exponential improvements in cost and quality of DNA reading and writing (R&W) up to 10 million fold, and a series of NGS technologies (for example, fluorescent microscopy, nanopore and direct electronic measures).
